A CHANGE FOR THE BETTER

Some clubs seem to go through a constant change to the club colours partly as an upgrade and in some cases to avoid strip clashes with other clubs.

Here at the Tigers we have maintained our colours for 60 years. Yes we have changed the style of the shirts but never the colours. EPPING OVAL CONVERSION

Due to the increase in small sided games up to and including U11's and the oval not being fully used on Saturday mornings we have decided to have Epping Oval double marked to accommodate small sided games. It is hoped (but not guaranteed) that our SSG teams will play the majority of their games at Epping Oval thus reducing travelling times previously experienced. To accommodate this we have invested in new SSG goal posts (portable) which will add a little extra time to the ground dressing

time both in the morning and the undressing at midday when the ground returns to a full sided field.

Alexanders Netball Club is a small, family orientated club that would like to build on its numbers to help ensure the club will survive for another 50 years. Season 2012 is the first year we have not had a "baby" team as we like to call them. In fact, we "lost" 2 teams in 2012 compared with 2011 numbers. The club can no longer afford to wait for players to come to us as there are many clubs out there with a higher community profile so we have decided to be pro-active this year by using what we have to our advantage – advertising, community spirit, school contacts and enthusiasm! We feel that it is through our babies – 8 and 9 year olds that the club will continue to grow and be competitive in the Eastwood Ryde Netball Association competition.

At Alexanders, each team has a qualified and very patient coach who, along with parental help and encouragement, teaches the children the rules. Players aged 8 and 9 learn to play netball using modified rules to suit their age, capabilities, size and strength. This allows the children to get used to the rules and learn the skills in a more relaxed setting while having fun and enjoying the learning at the same time as participating in a team sport. Each player has the opportunity to play all positions so they can then chose or perhaps be guided toward a position that best suits their ability and strengths. Coaches often join the children in their laughter as they try different skills – drop a ball or forget what they are doing, while continuing to encourage them to try again and praising them for their efforts no matter what the result is.

While our registrar Scott McGoogan has very strong ties to the Epping Eastwood Football Club, his wife Dianne has equally strong ties to Alexanders Netball Club and is their treasurer. Through this common link, both clubs have been working together in an effort to expand player numbers. One initiative saw both clubs provide a "Come 'n' Try" session at Epping Heights Public School aimed at 8 & 9 year olds with all children thoroughly enjoying themselves.

If you have a sister, friend, neighbour or perhaps even yourself would like to play netball, Alexanders would love to hear from you. You would be joining 5 other Tigers families who have already made the connection – all be it unknowingly! Sisters of players from the under 11's right through to wife of our Super League coach are already playing netball with Alexanders.
