Our voyages increase self-awareness, develop teamwork and leadership skills and create a strong sense of community responsibility amongst members of the youth crew.

Spurred on by the experiences of my brother and sister, I filled out the online application over a year before the expedition began. I applied to for every journey that the ship took around Australia, and within a year I was lucky enough to be chosen out of thousands of applicants.

My favourite experience of the voyage was 'Command Day' where the crew took over and ran the ship for 24 hours. We had to complete fun and interesting challenges as well as sail to strange locations. The crew elected a captain who was required to boss everyone around the boat. I completed activities and tasks around the boat as required by the captain. These included steering the ship, setting the sails and climbing the foremast. Climbing the foremast was exhilarating and fun.

Another experience that I really enjoyed was the day stop at Heron Island. The water was crystal clear, a characteristic I enjoyed as we went snorkelling in the warm ocean. This allowed us to see a wide variety of sea life and colourful coral. The day was topped off as dolphins dove under the boat.

As we entered Gladstone Harbour the crew sat along the Course, Topsail and the Top Gallant with our feet hanging high about the deck. We waved to our parents and loved ones as we returned from a once in a lifetime experience. Dangling above the ocean, so high in the air is a unique and wonderful feeling mixed with euphoria.

The Young Endeavour Youth Scheme is a tremendous experience and I recommend that everyone apply!
