President's letter

reetings to all! We have reached the halfway point of the Premiership rounds, my how time flies when you are having fun. Seriously, I hope that you are having a great time in playing the game and making new friends along the way whether as a player, coach, manager or importantly as parents. This last group are often forgotten and not given the recognition they deserve in sport. Without their support and encouragement games such as ours at park level would fail to exist. So let's hear it for the mums and dads who do so much along the way.

I thought we would look at the report card for the season so far. As a club we are sitting in 9th position. We have 28 teams who are in "competition" i.e. teams which compete for a premiership starting at U10's through to Premier League. Of the 28 we currently have 12 teams in the top 4 followed by 9 teams in the 5th or 6th position. Sure we have some who from a points standing are not doing that well – but hang on and watch this space. We have weeks ahead of us to improve our overall position, so "Let's Go Tigers"!

While results are important sometimes you have to look past them and measure other benefits such as meeting people, developing social skills, building friendships, getting away from electronic games and making the body work. These are but a few. You can add to this list yourself – but in the end you play for the reason best suited to what you want. And that's the important criteria – YOU.

I don't often single out teams in my letter but as this is a "report card" let's congratulate our I I/4 and I I/6 teams. Both teams have played 7 games and won 7. At the other end of the ages, our 45/1's have also done the same scoring 49 goals and on a bad day have conceded I.

It is good to see that at both ends of our club we are at this time posting positive results. Let me repeat — that is not to say others are not. It

is also a matter of perception and I also acknowledge that we have got some incorrect team gradings and on that point all clubs would agree they also suffer in this situation.

The weather has also been favorable. It has been described as an Indian Summer (whatever that is) and our much loved Boronia Park whilst showing signs of wear has done very well to the halfway point of the season. In the last 10 days it has again been fertilized. This makes 4 times since the end of the previous year. Our Council (Parramatta) have been very supportive.

Last Saturday Premier League First Grade played the competition leaders, Kenthurst, at Boronia. Unfortunately one of our favorite sons, Matthew Corringham, suffered a season ending injury, a broken/shattered patella (kneecap) very early in the game. Not caused by anyone, he just fell down. The game was stopped until medical attention arrived and he had surgery Saturday night and is on the long road to recovery. We wish him well. Matthew is well known and respected within the sport and the messages of support from those outside of the Epping Eastwood Family have been thankfully received.

Just on that point, it is worth remembering if a player is injured and on the ground and unable to show signs that they can recover with some assistance — we must not move them. All we can do is make sure they can breathe and keep them warm until medical help arrives. The referee must stop the game. There are protocols in place as to how the game can be restarted after the player's wellbeing has been attended to. The player's needs are our first and top priority.

In Matthew's case we are indebted to the assistance of Kenthurst's physio who provided care and attention until the ambulance staff took control. I am sure that his recovery was assisted by the news that EEW won the game I-0. The best on the ground was Daniel Buttery
