resident's letter

Well the last two weeks have been most disruptive for our game and a very busy time for our team managers and coaches as we have navigated our way around the prevailing weather conditions.

It is a regular occurrence for me to talk via emails and text messages to your team manager and coach and I thought I would share with you some of the 'behind the scenes' topics we talk about.

In the last two weeks it has been mainly about the weather and how it affects the game and how it impacts on you as a player. Obviously none of us can control the weather and the last two weeks have had an impact on training, matches and the condition of the playing fields. The vast number of fields are controlled by local councils. In our case (Boronia) Parramatta City are if you like, our landlord. We as a club rent the ground and have done so since 1952. We have an excellent working relationship with Parramatta Council and in most cases they make the decisions to open or close the ground based on the criteria of safety, ground damage and suitability based on weather forecasts. On some occasions we, Epping Eastwood, will have input and are empowered to make the decision as was the case last Saturday.

Over the last two weeks EEW decided on the Friday to move the morning games to other locations in conjunction with GHFA who assist us to ensure at least Juniors get to play on game day thus avoiding double headers (playing Saturday and Sunday). When it comes to Senior teams it is rarely possible to move them as we have no spare grounds so they are required to play double headers and that is quite taxing for most, especially for our 35/45s not only from the physical perspective but also family life. We try very hard to play Senior games and sometimes by moving the Junior games and resting the ground in the morning we are able to play the senior games in the afternoon.

Night training has been severely disrupted on Boronia this last two weeks as the rain has continued and the ground is not recovering for a variety of reasons – which with the best will in the world we have to live with. Despite a lot of work and money in the last few years to improve the position this season looks like going down as one of our worst.

Our communications to you our players by the team managers appears to be working well and for that we should all be grateful. I for one am appreciative of that. At the same time we also appreciate your patience as we continue to get the message out as quickly as possible. Last weekend was a classic case, that as the kickoff time approached we found Clubs were closing grounds. This occurred at Epping Oval, among others, as we scrambled to make contact with those teams that had early kickoffs.

To conclude this letter may I draw your attention to a matter that is occurring in our game within the association (34 Clubs) far too often – verbal abuse to match officials. It seems to be starting from teams aged 15 through to All Age. This is unacceptable and it is being dealt
